View of Barbot Hall, Rotherham, Yorkshire

Pen and grey ink and watercolour heightened with touches of white and scratching out on laid paper

Grimm visited Yorkshire on his way to see his patron Richard Kaye (1736-1809) who was Prebend of Durham (see Rotha Mary Clay, Samuel Hieronymus Grimm, 1941, pp.90-92). A sketch made by Grimm in Newcastle is dated 10th August 1778 and views of Wakefield, York, Fountains, Ripon, Richmond and Whitby are recorded. A view of Micklegate Bar, York was published as an engraving in 1790.

Barbot Hall is in the northern outskirts of Rotherham in South Yorkshire.
